Our Programs

HOMEBUYER PROGRAM Our Homebuyer program makes the dream of ownership possible for many Fox Cities families. A safe, affordable home empowers a family to invest in a secure future for themselves and their children. It allows qualified, low income, hardworking people to purchase a home with a 0% interest mortgage loan.

HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

The Home Repair program provides reputable and affordable home repair solutions to low income homeowners so that the family's health, safety, and well-being is enhanced. These services may also alleviate serious safety risks and code violations.

ALMOST HOME



The Almost Home program helps people become eligible for our Homebuyer program. Case managers

prepare buyers for ownership with financial education, guidance and resources to qualify.



RENTAL PROGRAM

Habitat's Rental program creates a unique, temporary housing solution for families in the Almost Home program.

Habitat purchases blighted properties and rehabilitates them into safe, decent and affordable rental properties.



ROCK THE BLOCK

Rock the Block is a multi-day event that kicks off Habitat's Neighborhood Revitalization efforts in targeted

communities. Habitat brings together residents, municipalities and community partners to complete exterior home repairs for low income homeowners and community projects to improve and beautify the neighborhood surrounding the homes.



HABITAT RESTORE

Appleton Habitat ReStore is a nonprofit home improvement store and donation center that sells new

and gently used furniture, appliances, home accessories, building materials, and more. The proceeds from these sales directly fund Fox Cities Habitat's mission.



GLOBAL HOMEBUILDING

Habitat for Humanity's vision is a world where everyone has a decent place to live. Fox Cities Habitat partners

with developing countries to provide financial and volunteer resources desperately needed to improve their housing conditions.

The need for affordable housing:

1 in 9 households in Wisconsin spend half or more of their income on housing.

There is a shortage of over 126,000 affordable rentals available for extremely low-income families in Wisconsin.

There is a 3 to 5 year wait for subsidized housing in the Fox Cities.*

Why affordable housing matters:

Habitat for Humanity knows that a decent, affordable place to live can create a situation where homeowners save more, invest in education, pursue opportunity, and have more financial stability.

Affordable housing creates diverse communities, builds equity, reduces inequality, and ensures that people with different incomes can have safe and stable homes, ultimately improving overall well-being and decreasing homelessness.

Fox Cities Habitat is a leader in providing innovative housing solutions to address the needs specific to low-income families in our community.

- For families interested in becoming homeowners: Habitat's Homebuyer, Almost Home, and Rental programs.
- For current homeowners needing critical home preservation and repair services: Habitat's Home Repair program and Rock the Block.
- · For vulnerable neighborhoods and communities- distressed properties in need of some TLC: Rock the Block.
- For the entire community: Appleton Habitat ReStore.

How Opportunities Open

Every family who purchases a home from Habitat for Humanity must meet certain requirements.

SHOW A NEED

Each potential homebuyer is facing some sort of inadequate living condition. Whether it's unaffordable rent, homelessness, living in a home in disrepair or a home that is inaccessible for a family member with disabilities, each family who comes to Greater Fox Cities Area Habitat for Humanity demonstrates a need for adequate housing.

CAN PAY BACK A LOAN

Although Habitat for Humanity homes are zero interest loans, a family is still required to make payments on that loan. Home ownership requires a mortgage, and families who receive help from Habitat for Humanity are receiving an opportunity to achieve something they couldn't do otherwise. Families work with Habitat staff to make sure they can make monthly payments before construction begins.

IS WILLING TO WORK FOR THE HOME

Habitat for Humanity homes are not a handout. Families must help in the construction process and are expected to put in 200 to 400 hours of labor to help build their home, build other Habitat family homes, learn how to take care of their home through workshops, volunteer at our ReStore, and do community service outside of Habitat. This way families learn how their home is constructed and how to fix or repair parts of their home once they are living there.

Maya and Mirabella have faced many challenges throughout the last couple of years. After going through an unexpected divorce, Maya found herself in the position of needing to find a new job that could support her family.

Her home needed a variety of repairs, from a leak in her basement to porches that were in such poor condition that it was unsafe for anyone to walk on. Yolanda is ecstatic and relieved that Rock the Block was able to provide a long-term solution to the water issue in her basement, and that she can now sit on her porch without the fear of her (or her guests) falling through.

Yolanda stated, "When I saw the Fox Cities Habitat Rock the Block program was coming to my neighborhood, and found out that I had been accepted, it was a huge weight lifted off my shoulders. It's great to know that if you need help, people in the community will be more than willing to help you out. They take time out of their busy days and schedules just to help out a neighbor. It's amazing."

Jacki applied to Fox Cities Habitat because she wanted to have a safe, affordable, and secure place for her and her daughter - a place where they could live and not just survive. Now that they have a place to call their own, Jacki and McKaylee are excited to pursue their education and job goals.

"A home to me is a warm, safe place to be. Where family can gather and memories can be made. A safe place where there is no judgment or restrictions. A home is a place we can be ourselves."

In Wisconsin, 1 in 9 households spend half or more of their income on housing.



Housing costs have reached their highest levels in years, while the supply of homes for sale has reached a new record low- the shortage being even greater for lower-priced homes. "Cost-burdened" refers to households that spend 30% or more of their income on housing expenses while "severely cost-burdened" households spend 50% or more. This financial strain affects low-income households' ability to cover basic needs for a successful household such as food, healthcare, utilities, education, and more. It can lead to constant stress, limited savings, and increased risks of housing instability. Households that find themselves in these situations have a difficult time bouncing back from unexpected life events. The importance of advocating for home affordability and stability has never been greater.



Celebrating 30 Years



In 2023, we celebrated 30 years of Greater Fox Cities Area Habitat for Humanity. We had the opportunity to sit down with two of our longesttenured volunteers, Jim Parker and Bill Devine, to hear their stories and celebrate Fox Cities Habitat's 30 year anniversary. Bill and Jim have volunteered alongside each other for decades, and have seen Fox Cities Habitat transform and grow immensely. These gentlemen have undoubtedly turned their volunteering into a labor of love.

Jim started volunteering with us 30 years ago and is one of the founding members of the Construction Manual Committee, was part of the foundation of our Senior Crew, and has been an active volunteer on our construction sites. Bill started volunteering with us about 25 years ago and is on the Marketing Committee, ReStore Committee, and helps with many projects throughout the organization. Bill and Jim have seen Fox Cities Habitat grow exponentially from two staff members in a closet at the local Goodwill, to an affiliate with over 40 employees and over 1,400 volunteers.

Because of the dedication of our staff and volunteers, Fox Cities Habitat has been able to make a significant impact over the last 30 years. Together, we have helped over 1,000 people in our community earn safe and affordable homes, revitalized 20 neighborhoods in the Greater Fox Valley through our Rock the Block program, have helped over 100 families received affordable repairs through our Home Repair program, and have diverted 12.2 million pounds from our landfills because of our ReStore. Our volunteers have put in over 1,000,000 hours in order to make these accomplishments happen.

The impact we've made is directly because of committed volunteers like Jim and Bill. Thank you both, and all volunteers, for the endless time, energy, and support you have given to this organization.




